



Calvary Church Family,

A door has been opened for us to put together a team to assist with the building of a Bible School in the Amazon Rain Forest. In addition to the construction work on the Bible School, the team will have the opportunity to share testimonies to the adults and present the gospel to the children at churches in 2-3 different villages.

We have been invited to work under the direction of Tim and Debbie Anderson, seasoned veteran missionaries who have served as missionaries to Ecuador for 34 years. They run the Quito Men's Teen Challenge, plant churches in the Amazon jungle and oversee Child Hope Schools among the Shuar Indians.

WHEN: June 20-27, 2020

WHY: The proposed "Amazon Bible School" will be used as the main training center for Shuar Pastors, Missionaries, teachers. There are more than 600 unreached villages deep in the Amazon Rain Forest for the Shuar and another 400 for their cousins, the Atchshuar, as well. *That is a total of 1000 villages that need to be reached for Christ. This is a great need which can only be met by multiplying trained church leaders!!*

Our ministry to the adults and children in the village churches will be a powerful source of encouragement to believers as well as a great opportunity to bring non-believers to Christ.

HOW: Each team member who desires and feels a calling to be a part of this team will need to raise approx. \$2000. That is based on an estimated team size of 15 people. Built into the estimated per person cost is \$10,000 required by the missionary to cover the associated construction costs. We will invite our whole Calvary Church family to donate towards the cost of this trip but those who sign up should plan to cover approx. \$1400 of the cost on their own.

An interview with Pastor Randy and a \$500 deposit is required by Feb. 1 to secure a spot on the team. If you are interested in this trip take these two steps:

1. Pray and ask God to speak to you if this trip is for you.
2. Contact Pastor Randy ASAP and let him know you are prayerfully considering it.
